Comment: Douglas Greenberg, Professor of History, Princeton University.

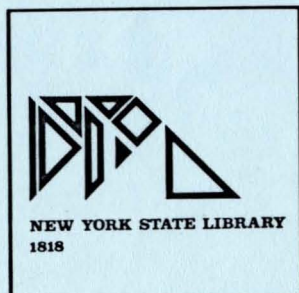
The seminar is open to the public - no admission charge.
