

David William Voorhees is Director of the Papers of Jacob Leisler Project at New York University and since 1990 been Managing Editor of *de Halve Maen*, a quarterly scholarly journal devoted to New Netherland studies. Formerly the Managing Reference History Editor at Charles Scribner's Sons and a Co-Editor of *The Papers of William Livingston*, he received a Ph.D. in history from New York University in 1988. His published works include *The Concise Dictionary of American History* (1983), *The Holland Society: A Centennial History 1885-1985* (1985), and *Records of the Reformed Protestant Church of Flatbush, Kings County, New York, Volume 1, 1677-1720* (1999) and *Volume II, Midwood Deacons' Accounts 1654-1709* (2008), as well as numerous articles. He was a New York State Council of the Humanities Speaker in 1996-1998.
