The Capitol building was constructed between 1867 and 1899 and has the famous million-dollar staircase which is a must-see attraction.

Home of Hendrick Van Rensselaer who built the home during the 18th Century.

First (Reformed) Church: 110 N Pearl St, Albany, NY 12207

The oldest Church in Upstate New York was erected in 1798.

Schuyler Mansion: 32 Catherine Street Albany, NY 12202

Home to Philip J. Schuyler, Revolutionary War General and a U.S. Senator from 1789 to 1791. Schuyler and his wife Catherine Van Rensselaer are descendants from early Dutch settlers.

Home to Abraham Ten Broeck the 28th Mayor of Albany whose family were Dutch settlers.

The oldest building in Albany built in 1728 tying to Albany's Dutch roots.

The second oldest building in Albany, built in 1736. Named after the Dutch family, Quackenbush, who resided in the home.
